

The winter season can be tough for both children and parents – it gets darker outside earlier and the cold, snowy weather has everyone cooped up indoors. It doesn't have to be a gloomy time for you and your children, though. Here are some tips to help your family beat the winter blues:

- During the winter months, people tend to crave comfort foods such as pasta, breads and sugar, but continue to include a variety of fruits, vegetables and whole grains in your family's diet to keep everyone from feeling tired.
- Spend time outdoors with your family for at least 30 minutes each day, even if it's cold and cloudy outside.
- Keep the inside of your home light by opening window blinds throughout your house.
- If possible, plan a family trip to a sunnier climate during the winter.
- Establish a set bedtime for you and your children to ensure everyone is getting 7 to 8 hours of sleep each night. Depression may be triggered if you get too much or too little sleep.

- When indoors, spend family time together by playing a board game, putting a puzzle together, watching a movie or doing crafts and fun projects.


Thursday, February 10, 2022
