MCA

We are nearing the end of our MCA testing sessions for our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students. Students have been working hard to do their best on each test. We do get preliminary results back on their tests, but scores are not finalized until late summer. All families will be receiving notification on the results for their child at the beginning of next school year.

Class Placements

One question I receive from parents is, "How are homeroom classes put together?" We do have a process for placing each student in the best homeroom possible for the next year. We weigh a lot of factors when it comes to placing students. Each teacher will look at each of their students and fill out information around their reading, math academics, learning style, and more. I meet with each grade level and we take the information completed by teachers and we start to place students in homerooms for next year.

Besides looking at the information completed by homeroom teachers, we also look at support that can be offered by special education in the classroom, peer relationships, overall classroom dynamics, personality of the teachers in the grades above, and any past history from previous grades. Once we have the classes set, we add up numbers in academic and other areas and make sure that each class has a good mix for the following year.

I have had parents ask if I make all the classes. No, I do not. I know our teaching staff very well, but they know their students better than me. I have also been asked the question if parents can request a teacher. Again, the answer is no. If I let every parent put in a request for their child's teacher... well, you can imagine about how that would go.:)

Hopefully that information gives a little background as to what goes into our classroom placement process. It is a lengthy process, but worth every minute as we work to set up success for students for the following year.


